# Re-elected GOP chair challenges Dems

### DeVos sees 1998 as 'best Republican year in a generation'

DETROIT — Betty DeVos of Ada was re-elected Michigan Republican Party chair Saturday and told GOP members, licking their wounds over election losses last year, "we will make 1998 the best Republican year in a generation."

DeVos was elected by acclamation. She had no opposition. She said she'll soon resign her other post, as Republican national spokeswoman, to concentrate on leading the party. A new national spokeswoman is scheduled to be selected in April at a meeting of the GOP state committee. According to party officials, Sharon Wise of Owosso, a member of the State Board of Education, is expected to win the post.

Still, Republicans were regrouping after several painful election losses last November, when they lost the presidential race in Michigan, the U.S. Senate race and the state House majority. The two-day convention was used to fire up the party faithful and re-energize its members.

Dominating conversation among the almost 3,000 Republicans at the GOP convention was the future of Gov. John Engler, who has not said whether he'll seek re-election. Saturday, he said only that he plans to decide by the end of the year.

## State senator asks help in clearing Booth doc

DETROIT — It's been more than 120 years since Dr. Samuel Mudd was convicted for treating the leg John Wilkes Booth broke when he leaped to the stage of the Ford Theater after shooting President Lincoln.

Booth was shot and killed by Union soldiers 11 days later. Mudd argued that even if he had recognized Booth, news of the assassination had yet to reach his community. But the fact that he treated Booth was enough for the military panel to convict him.

While not overly optimistic about the attention his letter will get among the president's other concerns, Van Regenmortel said he still thinks the case could serve a valuable lesson. About 30 of Mudd's relatives now reside in Michigan.

"What a wonderful reminder of our rich history would take place if Dr. Mudd were to be pardoned," Van Regenmortel said Saturday.



**Q:** I'm past menopause. Do I still need to have annual gynecologic exams?

**A:** Most definitely yes. Once a woman gets past a certain point in her life she may feel that she no longer needs gynecological care. Some women believe that once they are no longer having children, have stopped menstruating, are no longer sexually active, or have had their uterus removed they do not need a pelvic exam. Unfortunately this is wrong - sometimes dead wrong.

As women get older, they are at INCREASED risk for cancer of the uterus (womb), ovaries (where the eggs were), and vulva (the outside female parts). By not having yearly exams, opportunities to detect cancer in the early stages are missed. Though controversy exists as to whether all women need a yearly "pap" smear (a scraping of the womb opening as a test for cervical cancer), it is agreed that every woman needs an annual pelvic exam, including a visual examination and a check for abnormal growths.

Cancer risk is not the only reason to continue gynecological exams. Some other situations that may need attention include the risk for pelvic infections, hormone replacement therapy, bladder control and pelvic prolapse ("falling down" of structures of the pelvis, such as the bladder, uterus, rectum or vaginal walls into the vagina).

In short, all women, no matter what their age, need routine yearly pelvic examinations to maximize their health.
