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DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE CONTRACTOR OF SUCH TERMINATION: OR (2) BY NEGOTIATING WITH THE CONTRACTOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. THE STATE SHALL PAY CONTRACTOR FOR, IF APPLICABLE: (A) DELIVERABLES IN PROGRESS; (B) THE PERCENTAGE THAT HAS BEEN COMPLETED SATISFACTORILY; AND, (C) FOR TRANSACTION-BASED SERVICES UP TO THE DATE OF TERMINATION, TO THE EXTENT WORK HAS BEEN PERFORMED SATISFACTORILY.

CONTRACT

BE IT KNOWN, the Department of Education, Office of <u>Teaching and Learning</u>, of the State of Louisiana (hereinafter sometimes referred to as State) and <u>New Solutions K12 29 Winthrop Road Brookline, MA 02445</u> (hereinafter sometimes referred to as Contractor) do hereby enter into a contract with funds which can be provided by the program entitled <u>Esser II & IDEA</u>, under the following terms and conditions. If a federal program, provide Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance Number <u>84.425 D & 84.027A</u>.

Scope of Services

Contractor hereby agrees to furnish the following services:

Specific goals and objectives:

To improve the outcomes for students with disabilities and help address accelerating learning in the wake of the learning loss caused by the COVID pandemic. The work will include a number of interconnected elements. 1. Help spread the adoption of best practices for students with disabilities. 2. Provide staffing and scheduling support for school leaders. 3. Support the adoption and increase the impact of balanced calendars. The proposal will help LDOE support districts to implement the best practice guidance and better serve students across the state.

Deliverables:

Part A

- **o** Develop compelling and clear documentation and messaging assuring the field that all aspects of the guidance are in accordance with IDEA regulations.
- **o** Develop compelling and clear documentation and messaging assuring the field how IDEA funds can be used in more and better ways to implement the guidance.
- o Identify best practice examples across the state.
- Provide professional development to the field related to the best practices, the revised playbook, the legality of the guidance, best uses for IDEA funds and other related topics
- o Assess additional needs from the field to support adoption and effective implementation.

Part B

- **o** Assess current state of staffing and scheduling implementation by conducting interviews and focus groups.
- **o** Provide asynchronous professional development statewide on staffing and scheduling best practices, primarily focused on school leaders.
- o Provide intensive technical assistance to a cohort(S) of school leaders and their district leaders.

Part C

- **o** Support districts in the balanced calendar cohort.
- **o** Learn From early adopters by conducting surveys and focus groups with the balanced calendar cohort.
- **o** Create a playbook for districts interested in adopting balanced calendars.
- **o** Share the findings of the lessons learned and the playbook widely across the state.

• **Performance Measures:** (that are quantifiable and time-bound)

Contractor will submit to LDOE

Part A

- Documented legality of the guidance.
- Gather influential support confirming the legality and compliance of the best practices.

- Create a compelling message and documentation.
- Identify the top 3-5 most impactful uses of IDEA Funds for implementing the best practices.
- Document the permissibility of these expenditures with IDEA funds.
- Create clear guidance and 'how to' document approving, with appropriate limitations and conditions, the desired uses of IDEA funds.
- Gather feedback from the field.
- Finalize and share allowable use of funds guidance.
- Identify and write brief summarizes of promising best practice implementation from schools, districts, and charter networks across the state.
- NSK12 will present either virtually or in person up to 25 times during the duration of this contract. These will be interactive sessions allowing ample time for Q + A.
- Gather feedback from the field, LDOE staff and others to determine what additional supports will be needed going forward and how best to provide them.

Part B

- Conduct a review of the current state of implementing staffing and scheduling best practices by implementing interviews and focus groups.
- New Solutions K12 will provide up to 25 professional development sessions. Many will be presented virtually.
- Provide four asynchronous modules on staffing and scheduling best practices.
- Provide each school leader and their leadership team up to 2 coaching calls.

Part C

- Provide 3 virtual technical support sessions to schools and districts working to implement balanced calendars.
- Conduct interviews and focus groups with school leaders, district leaders and school board members.
- Create a report on Balanced calendar interview and focus group findings.
- Create a short, easily to read playbook to help guide schools and districts on the journey towards effective balanced calendars.
- Share both the lessons learned and the playbook with districts, district leaders and school leaders across the state through three topic specific webinars.
- Monitoring Plan: (for adherence to contract requirements and completion of work)
 - **o** Education Program Consultant will review submitted materials and will communicate during the contract period to assure the deliverables are completed as planned.

(Contracts which do not include each of these requirements will be returned to the respective Office without action.)

Payment Terms

In consideration of the services described above, State hereby agrees to pay the Contractor a maximum fee of \$_1,039,500\$. Payment includes any and all expenses incurred by contractor. Payment will be made only on approval of Deputy Superintendent) The Contractor must use the standard Louisiana Department of Education Professional Services Billing Form for invoicing purposes.

Contracts ending May 31,2023 <u>must</u> submit final invoices no later than June 5.

Contracts with services completed by June 30 must submit invoices no later than July 5. Due to funding constraints, funding may be unavailable for payment of services if invoices are not received by this date.

If progress or completion is obtained to the reasonable satisfaction of the agency, payments are estimated to be scheduled as follows:

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

Term of Contract

This Contract shall begin on November 1, 2022 and shall terminate on June 30, 2023. The effective date of this Contract may be extended only if an amendment to that effect is duly executed by the contracting parties and approved by the necessary authorities prior to said termination date. If either party informs the other that an extension of this Contract is deemed necessary, an amendment may be prepared by State and forwarded to the other party for appropriate action by the other party. Said amendment should be returned to State with appropriate information and signatures not less than sixty-five (65) days prior to termination date. Upon receipt of the amendment, it will be forwarded to the necessary authorities for their approval. State cannot assure processing of Amendments submitted after this timeframe.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event shall the total term of this Contract, including extensions hereto, be for a period of more than three (3) years.

Taxes



Before the contract may be approved, La. R.S. 39:1624(A)(10) requires the Office of State Procurement to determine that the Contractor is current in the filing of all applicable tax returns and reports and in the payment of all taxes, interest, penalties, and fees owed to the state and collected by the Department of Revenue. The Contractor shall provide its seven-digit LDR Account Number to the State for this determination. The State's obligations are conditioned on the Contractor resolving any identified outstanding tax compliance discrepancies with the Louisiana Department of Revenue within seven (7) days of such notification. If the Contractor fails to resolve the identified outstanding tax compliance discrepancies within seven days of notification, then the using agency may proceed with alternate arrangements without notice to the Contractor and without penalty.

Reporting Income to State-Funded Retirement Systems

If the Contractor is receiving benefits from any State-funded retirement system, the Contractor is responsible for fully disclosing to the State, on or before the effective date of this contract, the existence and amount of such benefits and the date(s) of retirement. Failure by the Contractor to so disclose truthfully and accurately will be grounds for placing Rev. 5/21/2021 - including OSP revisions of 2/19/2021

the Contractor in default. If said failure results in the State being liable to any State-funded retirement system for penalties, interest, or repayment of benefits, the Contractor shall be liable to the State for repayment of such amounts.

Termination for Cause

Should the State determine that the Contractor has failed to comply with the Contract's terms, the State may terminate the Contract for cause by giving the Contractor written notice specifying the Contractor's failure. If the State determines that the failure is not correctable, then the Contract shall terminate on the date specified in such notice. If the State determines that the failure may be corrected, the State shall give a deadline for the Contractor to make the correction. If the State determines that the failure is not corrected by the deadline, then the State may give additional time for the Contractor to make the corrections or the State may notify the Contractor of the Contract termination date.

If the Contractor seeks to terminate the Contract, the Contractor shall file a complaint with the Chief Procurement Officer under La. R.S. 39:1672.2-1672.4.

Termination for Convenience

State may terminate the Contract at any time without penalty by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor of such termination or negotiating with the Contractor a termination date. Contractor shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress, to the extent the State determines that the work is acceptable.

Remedies for Default

Any claim or controversy arising out of this contract shall be resolved by the provisions of LSA - R.S. 39:1672.2 - 1672.4.

Governing Law

This contract shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, including, but not limited, to La. R.S. 39:1551-1736; rules and regulations; executive orders; standard terms and conditions, special terms and conditions, and specifications listed in the RFP(if applicable); and this contract. Venue of any action brought, after exhaustion of administrative remedies, with regard to this contract shall be in the Nineteenth Judicial District Court, Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

E-Verify

Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the provisions of La. R.S. 38:2212.10 and federal law pertaining to E-Verify in the performance of services under this Contract.

Record Ownership

All records, reports, documents, *products* and other material delivered or transmitted to Contractor by State shall remain the property of State, and shall be returned by Contractor to State, at Contractor's expense, at termination or expiration of this contract. All records, reports, documents, *products* or other material related to this contract and/or obtained or prepared by Contractor in connection with the performance of the services contracted for herein shall become the property of State, and shall, upon request, be returned by Contractor to State, at Contractor's expense, at termination or expiration of this contract.

Any work undertaken by Contractor pursuant to this contract shall be work made for hire, and Contractor hereby transfers and assigns to the State any and all intellectual property rights, included but not limited, to copyright to any records, reports, documents, products or other material created or developed by Contractor in connection with the performance of this contract. No records, reports, document, products or other materials created or developed under this contract can be distributed for free or for profit without the explicit written approval of the State Superintendent of Education.

If the contract is 8(g) funded, all provisions of this ownership clause apply except that upon termination or at the completion of 8(g) funding for a project/program, the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (SBESE) may approve a Contractor's request to retain equipment purchased with 8(g) funds based on the Contractor's assurance that the equipment will be used for educational enhancement.

Commissioner's Statements

Statements, acts and omissions made by or on behalf of the Commissioner of Administration regarding the RFP or RFP process, this Contract, any Contractor and/or any subcontractor of the Contractor shall not be deemed a conflict of interest when the Commissioner is discharging his/her duties and responsibilities under law, including, but not limited, to the Commissioner of Administration's authority in procurement matters.

Contractor's Cooperation

The Contractor has the duty to fully cooperate with the State and provide any and all requested information, documentation, etc. to the State when requested. This applies even if this contract is terminated and/or a lawsuit is filed. Specifically, the Contractor shall not limit or impede the State's right to audit or shall not withhold State owned documents.

Confidentiality

This contract is entered into by Contractor and the Department in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 17:3914, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. Section 1231(g), et seq., (FERPA) and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. Section 1400, et seq., (IDEA). Contractor hereby acknowledges that all documents which include personally identifiable information contained in or derived from a student's education records are deemed confidential pursuant to La. R.S. 17:3914, FERPA and IDEA. Contractor agrees not to re-disclose any such personally identifiable information without the prior written consent of the student's parent or the student, in the case of students who have reached the age of majority, or unless re-disclosure is otherwise authorized by law. Contractor agrees to return all documents deemed confidential pursuant to La. R.S. 17:3914, FERPA and/or IDEA to the Department at the conclusion of this contract.

Contractor shall protect from unauthorized use and disclosure all information relating to the State's operations and data (e.g. financial, statistical, personal, technical, etc.) that becomes available to the Contractor in carrying out this Contract. Contractor shall use protecting measures that are the same or more effective than those used by the State. Contractor is not required to protect information or data that is publicly available outside the scope of this Contract; already rightfully in the Contractor's possession; independently developed by the Contractor outside the scope of this Contract; or rightfully obtained from third parties.

Under no circumstance shall the Contractor discuss and/or release information to the media concerning this project without prior express written approval of the State.

Amendments

Any modification to the provisions of this Contract shall be in writing, signed by all parties, and approved by the required authorities.

Cybersecurity Training

In accordance with La. R.S. 42:1267(B)(3) and the State of Louisiana's Information Security Policy, if the Contractor, any of its employees, agents, or subcontractors will have access to State government information technology assets, the Contractor's employees, agents, or subcontractors with such access must complete cybersecurity training annually, and the Contractor must present evidence of such compliance annually and upon request. The Contractor may use the cybersecurity training course offered by the Louisiana Department of State Civil Service without additional cost or may use any alternate course approved in writing by the Office of Technology Services.

For purposes of this Section, "access to State government information technology assets" means the possession of credentials, equipment, or authorization to access the internal workings of State information technology systems or networks. Examples would include but not be limited to State-issued laptops, VPN credentials to access the State network, badging to access the State's telecommunications closets or systems, or permissions to maintain or modify IT systems used by the State. Final determination of scope inclusions or exclusions relative to access to State government information technology assets will be made by the Office of Technology Services.

Code Of Ethics

The Contractor acknowledges that Chapter 15 of Title 42 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes (R.S. 42:1101 et. seq., Code of Governmental Ethics) applies to the Contracting Party in the performance of services called for in this Contract. The Contractor agrees to immediately notify the state if potential violations of the Code of Governmental Ethics arise at any

time during the term of this Contract.

Collections Fees

If Contractor invoices the State, and State pays Contractor, for work not done or for work not done in accordance with this contract, or if the State for any reason pays Contractor any amount not actually owed by State to Contractor pursuant to this contract, or if Contractor owes money to the State for any reason whatsoever as a result of this contract, the State may refer this matter to the Louisiana Attorney General for collection. If the State does refer this matter to the Louisiana Attorney General, Contractor agrees to pay, in addition to the debt owed to the State, the State's reasonable attorney's fees, up to a maximum fee of thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%) of Contractor's debt.

Assignability

Contractor may assign its interest in the proceeds of this Contract to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution. Within ten calendar days of the assignment, the Contractor shall provide notice of the assignment to the State and the Office of State Procurement. The State will continue to pay the Contractor and will not be obligated to direct payments to the assignee until the State has processed the assignment.

Except as stated in the preceding paragraph, Contractor shall only transfer an interest in the Contract by assignment, novation, or otherwise, with prior written consent of the State. The State's written consent of the transfer shall not diminish the State's rights or the Contractor's responsibilities and obligations.

Right to Audit and Record Retention

Any authorized agency of the State (e.g. Office of the Legislative Auditor, Inspector General's Office, etc.) and of the Federal Government has the right to inspect and review all books and records pertaining to services rendered under this contract for a period of five years from the date of final payment under the prime contract and any subcontract. The Contractor and subcontractor shall maintain such books and records for this five-year period and cooperate fully with the authorized auditing agency. Contractor and subcontractor shall comply with federal and state laws authorizing an audit of their operations as a whole, or of specific program activities.

Fiscal Funding

The continuation of this contract is contingent upon the appropriation of funds to fulfill the requirements of the contract by the legislature. If the legislature fails to appropriate sufficient monies to provide for the continuation of the contract, or if such appropriation is reduced by the veto of the Governor or by any means provided in the appropriations act to prevent the total appropriation for the year from exceeding revenues for that year, or for any other lawful purpose, and the effect of such reduction is to provide insufficient monies for the continuation of the contract, the contract shall terminate on the date of the beginning of the first fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated.
